

Edelweiss Scarf



A MOREHOUSE ORIGINAL



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Size: approximately 9" x 65"

Yarn: 3 skeins of Morehouse Merino 3-strand (worsted weight, approximately 140 yards per skein)

Needles: #8 or #9, gauge isn't crucial but should be close to obtain similar sizing on scarf

Gauge: 4.75 stitches = 1 inch over pattern

Wildflower stitch (abbreviated WF):

Purl 3 together, leave those stitches on the needle, yo, purl the same 3 stitches together.

Using a stretchy cast on method (we like the long-tail cast-on), cast on 45 stitches.

Purl one row.

Begin Edelweiss pattern:

Row 1 (RS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, knit to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, p1

Row 2 (WS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, purl to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in front, p1

Row 3 (RS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, k4, *WF, k5, repeat from * to last 5 stitches, k3, slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, p1

Row 4 (WS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, purl to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in front, p1

Row 5 (RS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, knit to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, p1

Row 6 (WS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, purl to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in front, p1

Row 7 (RS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, k8, *WF, k5, repeat from * to last 4 stitches, k 2, slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, p1

Row 8 (WS): Slip 1 stitch with yarn in back, purl to last 2 stitches, slip 1 stitch with yarn in front, p1

Repeat these 8 rows until you have about 2 yards of yarn left, ending with Row 6.

Bind off loosely to match your cast on.

Finishing:

Darn in ends. Soak in lukewarm water, add mild soap if desired.

Rinse with water that's the same temperature as the wash water.

Squeeze out as much water as possible, and then
roll in a towel to remove additional moisture.

Lay flat to dry, shaping along the way.
