



Size: about 80" wide and 30" deep after blocking

Yarn: 3 skeins of Morehouse Merino Lace

Needles: US #7 or #8 (the shawl is knit back and forth, so as the number of stitches grows, you'll want long single-points or circular needles)

Gauge: 3-4 sts/in over pattern after blocking (gauge is not crucial)



Cast on 3 stitches.

Row 1: k1, yo, k1, yo, k1 (5 stitches)

Row 2: purl

Row 3: k1, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k1 (7 stitches)

Row 4: purl

Row 5: k1, *yo, k2tog, repeat from * to last 2 stitches, yo, k1, yo, k1 (9 stitches)

Row 6: purl

As the shawl grows, you'll repeat these two rows:

Odd-numbered rows (right side): k1, *yo, k2tog, repeat from * to last 2 stitches, yo, k1, yo, k1

Even-numbered rows: purl

Repeat these two rows until you have just enough yarn to bind off loosely (10 yards should do it). Bind off loosely.

Finishing: This is where the magic happens!

Wash in lukewarm water with mild soap (we recommend Palmolive). Rinse in water that's the same temperature and gently squeeze out as much water as you can. Roll up the scarf in a towel to remove even more of the remaining moisture. Now, stretch the scarf to its final dimensions and let it dry.
