

RAM'S HORN SHAWL

A MOREHOUSE ORIGINAL



- Size:** 16" deep at point; 72" from tip to tip
Yarn: 2 skeins of Morehouse Merino Lace
(225 yds/sk)
Needles: US #7 or #8
Gauge: 21 sts/4" before blocking

The Ram's Horn Shawl is knit with asymmetrical construction in Morehouse Merino Lace for amazing drape and superb softness. The curled ends symbolize the majestic horns of the Merino ram, one of few breeds with this characteristic.

You'll begin the shawl with setup rows, and then transition into the 4-row repeat.

As you slip the first stitch, do so knitwise, with yarn in back. Make sure the slipped stitches are loose enough to stretch over two rows when blocked, particularly on the increase edge.

Setup rows:

- Row 1: Sl1, kfb, k1, ptbl (5sts)
Row 2: Sl1, p2tog, kfb, ptbl (5 sts)
Row 3: Sl1, kfb, k1, p2 (6 sts)
Row 4: Sl1, p2tog, p1, kfb, ptbl (6 sts)
Row 5: Sl1, Kfb, *k1, p1, repeat from * to end (7 sts)

Begin pattern:

- Row 6: Sl1, p2tog, (k1, p1) to last 2 stitches, kfb, ptbl (7 sts)
Row 7: Sl1, kfb, (k1, p1) to last st, p (8 sts)
Row 8: Sl1, p2tog, (p1, k1) to last 3 stitches, p1, kfb, ptbl (8 sts)
Row 9: Sl1, kfb, (k1, p1) to end (9 sts)

Repeat pattern rows 6-9 until you have about 10 yards of yarn left.

Bind off loosely in pattern. Darn in ends. Wet block for best results.
